July, named after Julius Caesar, was originally Quintilis, meaning 'fifth month' in Latin, representing where it fell in the Roman calendar. It was renamed after Caesar's death. The seventh month is significant in various cultures, symbolizing transformation, creativity, and personal empowerment.

Special Sundays

During July there are a number of Special Sundays in the Methodist calendar



Held on the second Sunday in July (although it can be any Sunday you like), this is the children's charity of the Methodist Church. Founded in 1869 by Methodist minister Revd Thomas Bowman Stephenson in response to the poverty and danger faced by vulnerable and destitute children and young people living rough in London. Today it's grown to become a leading children's charity running over 500 projects and working with more children and young people affected by poverty, disability and abuse than any other UK charity.



The second Sunday in July (although a different date can be used if not convenient) is an opportunity to remember and pray for those who work at sea, and the people who support them. This day is an opportunity to reflect, pray, and take action for the brave men and women who work at sea and helps raise vital funds to support seafarers facing tough and often lonely conditions, often spending. months away from their families.

RURAL MISSION SUNDAY

Held on the third Sunday in July (or whenever is convenient) this celebrates the importance of small rural churches and their passion for mission. An initiative that began in 2016, this provides a real opportunity for rural churches to celebrate who they are and give

thanks for their community.


