Not "church" but may be of interest:  Winchcombe Pottery Centenary: three films marking 100 years of the Pottery Tickets £15 standard, £10 under 26. Isbourne Arts members £3 off	"MEMORY LANE" FILMS - Saturday September 12 - starts 7.30pm, doors open 5pm A rare chance to see Winchcombe as it was, almost 100 years ago. A beautiful Pathé short showing tantalising glimpses of life and work at the Pottery in 1930 is one of three films on show on September 12 to mark the centenary of Winchcombe's famous pottery. One Good Turn is a rare insight into the early years of the Pottery and in just four minutes, offers a glimpse of how things were. Also on show is Mud and Water Man, the acclaimed 1973 documentary on Michael Cardew. From the 1940s to the 1960s, Michael Cardew worked mostly in Africa, first in Ghana and then Nigeria. Filmed during a return visit to Nigeria and narrated by Michael Cardew, he looks back over his early career and the ventures in Ghana and Nigeria with interesting insights into the problematic realities of colonialism. Running time 50 minutes. This celebration evening also includes From the Clay, a unique look at every aspect of production at the thriving pottery and made by Bill Barton in 1982. The pottery team featured are: Ray and Mike Finch, Eddie Hopkins, Toff Milway, Bob Wilkins, Duncan Shaw, Jane Brooks, Sid Tustin. The shop lady is Muriel Finch (Ray's wife) and the customers are Sylvia and Ruth Barton. Donated in memory of Bill by his family to Winchcombe Museum, it has been playing as part of the centenary exhibition Sharing the Craft. Running time, 30 minutes.
